The Super Bowl: From World Playoff to Super Bowl Sunday

The Super Bowl is the championship game for the NFL, or National Football League. It is the most-watched sporting event in the U.S, and the second-most watched annual sporting event in the world. The seven most-watched broadcasts in American television history are super bowls. You can tell that the Super Bowl is a big deal, but how did it start?

Two rival leagues - In 1960, there were two rival football leagues: The American Football League (AFL), and the National Football League (NFL). These leagues fought for popularity and fans. On January 14, 1961, the AFL and NFL started planning a "World Playoff" game. It took another six years to make this dream a reality. After that, the AFL merged into the NFL. The name "Super Bowl" originated from an AFL manager seeing his kids play with a toy called a Super Ball. The game was originally called the AFL–NFL Championship Game, but the name "Super Bowl" eventually replaced it. The name grew and grew until the day of the Super Bowl became an unofficial holiday, Super Bowl Sunday, or Super Sunday for short.

Super Bowl Traditions - Every Super Bowl has been identified by Roman numerals. The exception was the 50th Super Bowl, which was known as Super Bowl 50.

Plastics: We learned that the triangle on the bottom of plastic bottles and containers does not mean its recyclable. The number in the triangle tells us what kind of plastic it is. In Berkeley, only #1,#2, and #5 plastics go in the

recycle bin, so check the number

before choosing your bin. #7 plastics and ones that say "compostable" can go right into the compost. We watched a video that shows how important recycling is. Plastics and metals can be melted down and turned into such things as new containers, clothing and other useful products. Paper and cardboard can be shredded into a thick soup, dried and pressed into the paper products we use every day.





Honey Cake

Ingredients ³⁄₄ cups of butter ³⁄₄ cups clear honey ³⁄₂ cup soft brown sugar ² eggs slightly beaten ¹-2 Tbsp milk ² cups self-rising flour

Preheat oven to 350 degrees1. Grease and line a 9" square pan with baking parchment.2. Gently heat the butter, honey and sugar, stirring frequently until well blended. Set aside and leave to cool slightly.

Variation: Add 1 tsp ground cinnamon or grated nutmeg to flour in step 3.

3. Beat the eggs and milk into the cooled mixture. Sift the flour over the top, stir in and beat well until smooth.

4. Tip the mixture into the prepared pan, leveling the surface. Put into hot oven and cook for about 30 minutes or until well risen, golden brown and firm to the touch.

5. Leave the cake to cool in the pan for 20 minutes then turn out, leaving the lining paper in place, onto a wire rack and leave to cool completely.

6. Peel off the paper and cut the cake into 16 squares. **By Maestra Aïda**
