

BPC COVID-19 Safety Plan for 2023–24 School Year (Updated 1/25/24)

Black Pine Circle School will continue to follow CDPH K-12 Guidance for Covid-19 Risk Mitigation for the 2023–24 school year. This plan will be updated and families will be notified if the guidance changes during the school year.

Vaccinations:

- California strongly recommends that all eligible individuals get vaccinated against
 COVID-19 and remain up-to-date to protect oneself and reduce transmission of the virus.

Ventilation:

- To increase the circulation of outdoor air, classroom windows and doors will be open when practicable.
- The school will continue to implement our ventilation and filtering procedures including HVAC/MERV-13 air filters.

Mask Wearing Guidance:

- BPC will have masks available for any student or staff member who wishes to wear one.
- Students and staff should follow CDPH guidance for When and Where to Wear a Mask, as well as masking guidance for specific situations (see below).
 - Per CDPH, individuals who test positive <u>should</u> wear a well-fitting mask around others for a total of 10 days in indoor settings.
 - BPC recommends that close contacts wear a mask for 10 days after their last exposure to a case, however, the school will not be monitoring mask-wearing for close contacts.
- In the event that BPC receives guidance from a local and/or state health department that
 requires a mask be worn while on campus, we will notify the BPC community as soon as
 is feasible.

Hand Washing:

- Students will continue to practice frequent hand washing/sanitizing throughout the school day.
- Teachers of young students will teach hand washing routines when the school year begins.

Meals:

Eating snacks and lunch will take place outside as weather permits.

COVID-19 Testing:

- CDPH recommends over the counter antigen tests be considered the primary option for detecting COVID-19 in schools.
- Testing should be considered when engaging in activities that might result in high-risk exposures (e.g. large gatherings, travel). Such activities may occur more often during major breaks from school.
- We ask families to invest in antigen tests for their students (readily available at CVS, Walgreens, Costco, etc.).

- If, for some reason, obtaining OTC COVID-19 tests is a hardship for your family, please contact Sonam Gonsar (Upper School Office Manager) or Lucy Morris (Lower School Office Manager).

What To Do If You Test Positive for COVID-19:

- Parents/guardians must report their student's positive test HERE. Reporting cases allows us to understand the number of cases in our community and ensure COVID-19 positive individuals receive appropriate return-to-school instructions.*
- Stay home if you have COVID-19 symptoms, <u>until you have not had a fever for 24 hours without using fever-reducing medication</u>, AND COVID-19 symptoms are mild and improving.
 - A mask <u>must</u> be worn while indoors for 10 days following a positive test with symptoms.
 - Symptoms of COVID-19 include:
 - Fever or chills
 - Cough
 - Shortness or breath or difficulty breathing
 - Fatigue
 - Muscle or body aches
 - Headache
 - New loss of taste or smell
 - Sore throat
 - Congestion or runny nose
 - Nausea or vomiting
 - Diarrhea
- If you test positive for COVID-19 and <u>do not have symptoms</u> please adhere to the following guidance:
 - Mask when you are around other people indoors for 10 days following a
 positive test. You may remove your mask sooner than 10 days if you have
 two negative tests taken at least one day apart.
 - Avoid contact with those at higher risk for severe COVID-19 for 10 days.
- Staff must report their COVID-19 case by filling out THIS FORM.
- Speak with your healthcare provider about treatment options.

Recommendations for Close Contacts (per CDPH):

• If you have COVID-19 symptoms you should mask and test right away.

^{*}The potential infectious period is 2 days before the onset of symptoms or the positive test date (if no symptoms) through Day 10. (Day 0 is the symptom onset date or positive test date).

- If you do not have symptoms, and are at higher risk of severe COVID-19 infection, you should test within 5 days.
- If you do not have symptoms and have contact with people who are at higher risk of severe COVID-19 infection, you should mask indoors when around such people for 10 days.

Exposure Notifications:

- Parents/guardians will receive routine close contact notifications during the 2023–24 school year.
- BPC will provide general notifications to the entire community when there is an outbreak in the school community.
 - An outbreak is considered 3 positive COVID-19 cases within a 7-day period that are epidemiologically linked.
- BPC will continue to follow Cal/OSHA notification requirements for faculty and staff who
 test positive or are exposed, including direct notification of exposures, case notifications,
 and outbreak notifications to staff members.
 - Cal/OSHA Outbreak definition: three or more COVID-19 cases among employees in an "exposed group" within a 7-day period*
 - Cal/OSHA Major Outbreak definition: 20 or more COVID-19 cases in an "exposed group" within a 30-day period

Reporting to the Berkeley Public Health Division:

 BPC will follow all guidance in regard to reporting positive cases to our local health jurisdiction, the City of Berkeley Public Health Division.

These health and safety guidelines are subject to change throughout the year depending on updated guidance/mandates from state and local health authorities.
